David A. Hyman is a Professor of Law and Medicine at the University of Illinois. He teaches or has taught health care regulation, civil procedure, insurance law, law & economics, professional responsibility, and tax policy. He focuses his research and writing on the regulation and financing of health care. While serving as Special Counsel to the Federal Trade Commission, Professor Hyman was principal author and project leader for the first joint report ever issued by the Federal Trade Commission and Department of Justice, “Improving Health Care: A Dose of Competition” (2004).

Professor Hyman is an adjunct scholar at the Cato Institute. He has been a visiting professor at the University of Texas and George Washington University Schools of Law, and a Professor at the University of Maryland School of Law. He is a member of the Illinois and District of Columbia bars and the American Law Institute. He has done trial and appellate work, and is admitted to the Sixth, Seventh, and Tenth Circuit Courts of Appeals, and the U.S. Tax Court. He has a B.A. (1983), J.D. (1989), and M.D. (1991) from the University of Chicago.
